# What is an ACS Data User Group?

- PRB and Sabre Systems establishing the group in partnership with U.S. Census Bureau
- Goal is to help data users communicate with each other about key ACS data issues and applications
- A 13-member Steering Committee formed to help guide the selection of topics and activities
- Membership is free and open to all ACS data users



- Why do we need an ACS Data Users Group?
  - Complex survey, always changing
  - Widely used by diverse group of data users, many working in isolation
  - Unmet need related to ACS data and issues
    - Over 100 applications for Steering Committee representing broad range of data users
    - Over 900 responses to PRB online survey requesting input on ACS topics and activities

  - Level of ACS knowledge
  - Frequency of ACS data use
  - Key ACS data issues
  - Interest in joining ACS Data Users Group

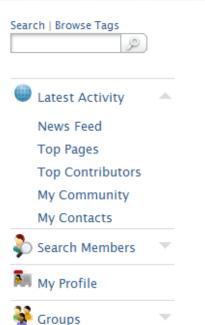


